

Falls Dam Access to Buffaloe Road Access of the Neuse is described as class I-II in A Paddler's Guide to Eastern North Carolina

by Bob Benner and Tom McCloud. This section is primarily moving water without rapids below the put in as the significant rapids lie in the 1/4 mile section upstream. This 1_{4} mile is referred to as the Tailrace of Falls Dam and is a small boulder garden that varies greatly in difficulty from class II-III depending on water levels. The entire trip from the Tailrace of Falls Dam to Buffaloe Road access is 10.7 miles with no public access points at the bridges of US Highway 1 and 401.

Usually, release rates above normal occur when the lake elevation reaches 251 feet or higher. Raleigh Parks and Recreation has a well established Adventure Learn to Program that offers instructional opportunities for people seeking to become proficient canoeists or kayakers. For a


